



## Add photos to texts

Tap , then take a photo and type your message. To instantly send a photo you've already taken, flick it into the message area.




## Say it with stickers

Add flair to your texts. Tap , then tap or drag a sticker. To get sticker packs, tap , then tap .



## Close all your Safari tabs at once

Have a bunch of tabs you no longer need? Touch and hold .




## Quickly open Camera

When iPad is locked, swipe left to access the camera.



## Talk instead of type

Tap  on the keyboard and speak your words (including punctuation), then tap Done.




## Save as PDF

You can save almost anything as a PDF. Tap , then tap Print. Pinch the first page of the preview, then tap  to save or send the document.



## Remove webpage clutter

Reader in Safari makes articles easier to read. When you see  in the search field, tap it to see just the text and photos — without ads.




## Send an audio message

In Messages, touch and hold  to record. Tap  to send the recording. To delete it instead, tap .



## Add titles without typing

In the Clips app (available free in the App Store), you can create animated captions and titles using your voice. Tap , tap a style, then simply speak while recording. To edit the titles, tap the text during playback.



## Find it fast

Search your iPad, the Internet, nearby places, the weather, and more — from anywhere on your iPad. Just swipe down from the top of the screen to show Search.



## Quickly react to a message

Instead of typing a reply, express yourself with a tapback! Double-tap a message bubble, then choose a response.




## Open webpages side by side

Rotate iPad to landscape, then touch and hold a link and choose Open in Split View. Swap the pages by swiping the tabs.



## Magnify the fine print

Go to Settings > General > Accessibility and turn on Magnifier. Then triple-click the Home button to use the camera to zoom in on small details. Tap  to enhance the image. Tap the shutter to freeze it.



## Take a screenshot

Press the Home and Sleep/Wake buttons at the same time. The picture is saved to the Screenshots album in Photos.




## Have iPad speak to you

iPad can speak selected text, or the entire screen. Explore the options in Settings > General > Accessibility > Speech.



## Manage a group chat

To add someone to an iMessage group chat, tap , then tap Add Contact. If you want to mute notifications during a lively exchange, turn on Do Not Disturb.
